STRUCTURE.

- Origin: ischial tuberosity.
- Insertion: perineal body of perineum.

FUNCTION.

- Concentric action: stabilize perineal body of perineum.
- Isometric action:
- Innervation: perineal branch of pudendal nerve of sacral plexus.
- Arterial supply: perineal branch of the internal pudendal artery.
